Resolutions:

- 1. Resolved to approve the curriculum structure and syllabus framed for B.A., English (Shift I & II) and M.A., English based on the premises of UGC/ CBCS / LOCF.
- 2. Resolved to motivate the students to accumulate more credits in their course of study through Credit Accumulation System (CAS) of the CBCS and LOCF.
- Resolved to recommend that more Subject Specific Courses and Skill Enhancement
 Courses be offered under Part IV in order to widen the scope of Credit Accumulation
 System.
- 4. Resolved to offer the Credit Accumulation option through SWAYAM platform and to ensure the entry for the same in the Consolidated Mark Sheet. It was also resolved that in order to enrich their knowledge, the students should be encouraged to enroll themselves in Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) in any subject (Subject Specific / Interdisciplinary) of their choice provided by various portals such as SWAYAM, NPTEL etc. initiated by MHRD. This can be availed by all the students in all the semesters and there is no minimum eligibility to take up this course by UG/PG students during their course of study (3 Years/2 Years).
- 5. Resolved to recommend to the department to offer diploma/certificate programmes which can be done concurrently by both the UG and the PG students. These courses will help the students shape their future career and widen their knowledge.
- Resolved to conduct certificate courses in Soft skill development and Translation studies as ability enhancement course and add on respectively. Resolved to approve the syllabi for soft skill development and translation studies.
